

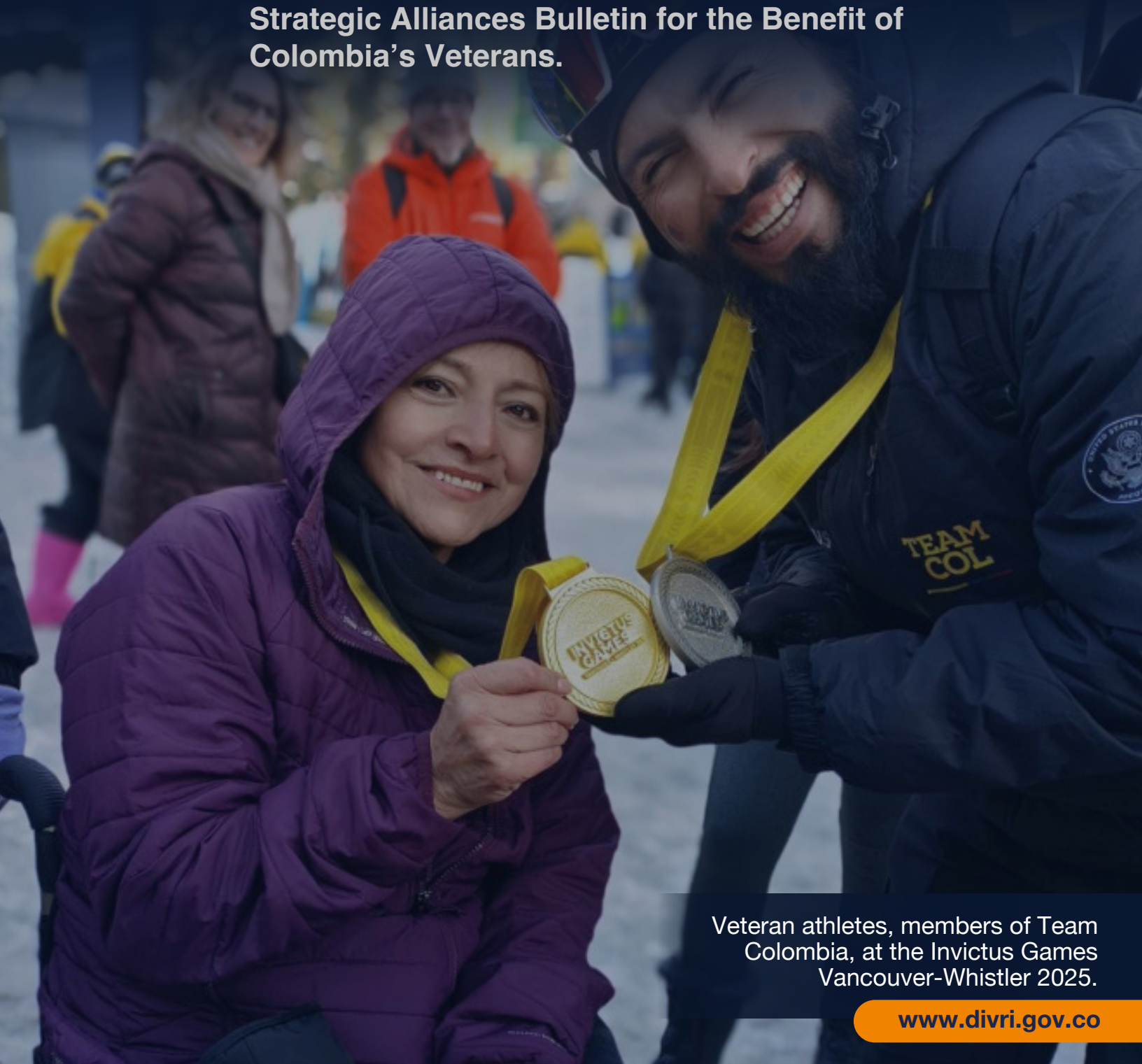

Let's Join Forces for our Colombian Veterans

As Colombian society faces significant challenges in unity, leadership, and value creation, our Public Forces veterans undeniably embody the discipline and commitment they developed while safeguarding our nation. Today, they are ready to contribute meaningfully to civil society.

Since its creation in 2021, the Directorate of Veterans and Inclusive Rehabilitation (DIVRI, by its initials in Spanish) of the Ministry of National Defense has been committed to creating not only well-being spaces but also education and training opportunities. The goal: to equip veterans with new competencies and skills that promote their inclusion and leadership in society.

This leadership has borne visible fruits. A truly inspiring example is that of our veterans with disabilities who, through effort and interinstitutional support, have achieved notable victories in adaptive sports. Team Colombia has earned 74 medals in international competitions, including Germany 2023 and Canada 2025, excelling in disciplines such as sitting volleyball, para-swimming, para-athletics, para-cycling, and even winter sports.

These accomplishments would not have been possible without the support of sports partners who believed in the talent and unbreakable spirit of our military and police veterans. Through sponsorships and donations, they not only backed this talent but also expressed deep gratitude for the veterans' service to the nation—helping turn personal dreams into victories for an entire country.

Our next challenge lies ahead in Birmingham 2027, where these athletes—and many others currently in training—will aim to represent Colombia with pride. From DIVRI, we extend a special invitation to the country's business community: invest in inclusion, peace, and the dreams of glory of our veterans with disabilities.

Veteran talent goes beyond sports. DIVRI has also supported champions in wheelchair fencing and launched cultural initiatives like the Veterans Show Orchestra, a group that sings for peace, culture, and

hope. Similarly, the book fair "Strokes of the Pen: Stories that Transform" brings to light the lived experiences of those who have turned their personal histories into sources of inspiration—awaiting sponsorship to see their works published.

Through the Productivity Route, we have supported veteran entrepreneurs with innovative ideas. One standout case is the creator of Colombia's first electronic tejo board—a clear demonstration of the ingenuity and resilience of this population.

While the debt owed by Colombian society to its Public Forces veterans is immense, we can begin by recognizing their resilience and their crucial role in strengthening our social fabric. I invite everyone to stand by our veterans and their families, creating opportunities for them to contribute and build a better nation.

Strategic Allies Enabled a Historic Participation in the 2025 Invictus Games

Team Colombia, comprised of 22 disabled veterans of the Public Forces, won a total of 20 medals at the 2025 Invictus Games, held in Canada from February 6 to 16.

Over the 10-day competition, Colombian athletes secured five gold, nine silver, and six bronze medals in disciplines such as snow biathlon, swimming, and indoor rowing. These events took place in Vancouver and Whistler, among delegations from 22 nations.

For the first time in history, Colombian veterans won a medal in a winter sport at an international event—an achievement made possible through the support of allies such as the Ministry of Equality and Equity (providing airfare) and the U.S. Embassy (providing uniforms and thermal clothing).

The U.S. Embassy Continues to Champion Veterans with Disabilities

The Narcotics Affairs and Law Enforcement Section (INL) and the Survivors Assistance Program (SAP) of the U.S. Embassy remain strategic allies of DIVRI. Beyond their sponsorship of the Invictus Games, they continue to support new opportunities for Colombia's veterans with disabilities in 2025.

Longport: A New Employment Ally

Thanks to INL's support, a new partnership has been formed with Longport—a company specializing in airport security services contracted by U.S. airlines. Longport has expressed its interest in hiring veterans with disabilities, recognizing their expertise in security and anti-narcotics operations.

On March 11, 2025, DIVRI, INL, and Longport held a meeting to review the recruitment process and establish commitments. A job announcement was posted on May 2 via DIVRI's website and social media channels. The selection process is currently underway.

Strong Ties with the Korean Government

» *The Koica Agency has always been a strategic ally of DIVRI, not only for DIVRI's construction but also for its ongoing support for Korean War Veterans and their descendants.*

The Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA), founded in 1991, offers governmental aid for socio-economic development in emerging nations. KOICA established its Colombia office in 2009 and has since supported numerous projects.

In 2016, KOICA financed the construction of DIVRI's building, investing \$11.5 million USD under a co-financing agreement between the Colombian and Korean governments. This facility serves disabled veterans in a setting distinct from traditional health contexts.

The Embassy of the Republic of Korea in Colombia has also demonstrated sustained support for veteran welfare through ongoing collaboration with DIVRI.

KOICA President Visits DIVRI

On March 7, 2025, KOICA President **Chang Won Sam** visited DIVRI. His visit included a floral tribute at the Korean War memorial and a high-level meeting with DIVRI leadership to explore new project collaborations.

President Chang also met two Korean volunteers, Na Yong Gi and Oh Hyun Jung, who offer Korean language and art classes through the **World Friends Korea (WFK)** program.

Recognizing Descendants of Korean War Veterans

DIVRI hosted a solemn ceremony to mark the 75th anniversary of the Korean War. Held in collaboration with the Korean Embassy and the Association of Descendants of Korean War Veterans (ADEVECO), the event honored veterans and provided \$25,000 USD in education grants to their descendants.
